

**General Notes**

1. Areas that are considered ground under repair or "wash out" areas will be marked for the Club Championship.
2. The ball will be played down (summer rules) unless posted on the scorecard on the day of the event. When posted "Winter Rules" or "Mark, Lift, Clean, and Place" will apply only to the fairway of the hole you are playing.
3. All players are required to hole out all of their putts during stroke play tournaments.
4. If there is a concern that you will not be able to find the last ball you hit please play a provisional ball.
5. All balls that are impacted by cart paths are to be played from the point where the ball comes to rest.
6. **Rule 3-3 Doubt as to Procedure** - If you have any questions during play regarding a ruling, notify the other players in your foursome, play two balls, and bring the ruling issue up with the rules committee after completing your round.
7. **Rule 6-5 Ball** - All players must communicate their ball and personal ball marking prior to the start of the tournament, prior to hitting a provisional ball and prior to replacing a lost ball.
8. **Rule 6-6 Scoring in Stroke Play** - After each hole the scorer should check the scores of all competitors and record it. If a penalty is assessed against a player, the player must be notified when the infraction occurs.
9. **Rule 8-1 Advice** - A player may not give advice to or ask advice from a competitor.
10. **Rule 12-2 Lifting Ball for Identification** - Player must announce his intention to identify the ball, mark the position of the ball, and provide his competitor the opportunity to observe the lifting and replacement.
11. **Rule 13-4 Ball in Hazard** - Player may not touch the hazard with hand or club, or touch or move loose impediments.
12. **Rule 24-2 Immovable Obstruction** - A player gets relief if his ball comes to rest on or if his swing or stance is impacted by, a cart path.
13. **Rule 25-1 - Relief from Abnormal Ground Conditions.** The player must lift the ball and drop it within (1) club length of the nearest point of relief and not nearer to the hole.
14. **Rule 26-1 Relief for Ball in Lateral Hazard.** Player has (3) options; 1) Penalty stroke and distance. Replay the shot from where the original ball was last hit, 2) Penalty stroke and drop a ball within 2 club lengths from the hazard, no closer to the hole, from the spot where the original ball last crossed the hazard, 3) Penalty stroke and drop a ball behind the hazard. There is no limit to how far behind the hazard the ball may be dropped.
15. **Rule 27-1 - Ball Out of Bounds and Lost Ball.** Penalty of stroke and distance and play the ball from the spot where the original ball was played.
16. **Rule 27-2 Provisional Ball** - Player must communicate that they are playing a provisional ball. Provisional ball is played from the point where the original ball was hit. If the original ball is found the player must abandon the provisional ball. Provisional balls become the ball in play if the original ball is lost or out of bounds. The penalty is stroke and distance.
17. **Rule 28 Ball Unplayable** - Player incurs a penalty of (1) stroke and the player has (3) options; 1) Penalty of stroke and distance, 2) Penalty stroke and drop a ball within two club lengths where the ball lay no nearer to the hole, 3) Penalty stroke and drop a ball behind the unplayable ball keeping that spot between the hole and the spot at which the ball is dropped. There is no limit to how far behind the ball may be dropped.

**Hole-Specific Notes**

- #1 - Lateral hazard stakes are located behind the green. The nearest point of relief from this hazard is on the hazard side of the cart path.
- #3 - Relief from the utility shed, man-made obstruction
- #4 - Lateral hazard stakes are located down the entire left side of this hole.
- #5 - Lateral hazard stakes are located down the entire right side of this hole.
- #6 - Lateral hazard stakes are located down the entire right side of this hole. The right side of the green that is rutted from water drainage will be marked and player can take relief.
- #7 - Any player that searches for their ball to the left of the green must play the ball if found and abandon any provisional ball.
- #8 - The landing area on the right side of the fairway is neither a wash out or round under repair. Play the ball as it lies.
- #9 - There is not a lateral hazard on this hole. Any player that searches for their ball on the left or right of the fairway, or behind the green must play the ball if found and abandon any provisional ball.
- #10 - Lateral hazards stakes are behind the green. The nearest point of relief from this hazard is on the hazard side of the cart path.
- #11 - There is not a lateral hazard on this hole. Balls to the right of the green and sand trap are to be played as they lie.
- #12 - The entire right side of this hole is marked "out of bounds". There are not lateral hazards on this hole.
- #13 - Lateral hazard stakes are located behind this green. The area at the end of the cart path will be marked as a wash out area.
- #14 - The entire left side of this hole, beginning in front of the tee and extending up to the green, is a lateral hazard. A drop area will be marked on the cart path for balls that enter the hazard off the tee. The player also has the option to take their penalty and hit their 3<sup>rd</sup> shot from the tee box. There is no relief from the stone wall.
- #15 - There is not a lateral hazard on this hole.
- #16 - There is not relief from any of the rocks on the left side of the green.
- #17 - The lateral hazard on the RH side extends from the start of the tree line on the RH side of the fairway thru the green. The lateral hazard on the left side begins at the start of the tree line and extends to the end of the tree line. There is not a lateral hazard on the LH side of the green. The landing area on the RH side of the fairway, before the hazard starts, will be marked as a wash out area if necessary.
- #18 - The lateral hazard is in front and to the left of the women's tee box only. RH side of the 18<sup>th</sup> green will be marked as a wash out area. The quarry is a lateral hazard. This hazard will be clearly defined and the stakes will be moved out away from the fence so the fence guarding the quarry does not interfere with a player's swing.
